Thanks to the launch of deconfinement for cultural spaces

authorised by the Federal Government, the **Royal Museum of Mariemont has the great pleasure to announce it's reopening on Tuesday the 26th of May.** Our doors will be open every day, except on Mondays, from 10am to 6pm.

Another good news: scheduled to end on the 24th of May, the exhibition “Bye Bye Future! The art of time travel” is extended until the 25th of October 2020. Interrogating the world of today and the possible futures through artworks of past and contemporary artists, the thematic of the exhibition has more than ever become accurate!

Wishing to guarantee **an attractive offer and a responsible reopening**, the Royal Museum of Mariemont has taken a series of precise dispositions. Here are some of the most important:

- Visits can only be done after a mandatory reservation through our reception. During the reservation you will be able to choose a date and time slot. Calls and mails are possible starting this Monday 18th of May (+32 (0)64 27 37 41, accueil@musee-mariemont.be).
- Visits are, for the moment, reserved for individual visitors (possibly accompanied by a friend) and for visitors living under the same roof. Wearing your masks is compulsory.
- Each adult will receive upon arrival a “visiting kit”, in which we integrate a free access to our next exhibition “The world of Clovis. Merovingian itinerary” (13th of February to 13th of June 2021)
- Our Restaurant the « Terrace of Mariemont » will stay closed until further notice.

Everything is implemented so as to guarantee the safety of your visit !

Our officers and watchmen are present to ensure the respect of the security regulations and our museum spaces are cleaned and disinfected daily. Physical distancing is reminded by markings on the floor. Arrows can guide the visitors through different possible courses throughout our collections and/or temporary exhibition.
